## LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Identify why resist/refuse cases are important and how they differ from other cases, including an analysis of the resist/refuse dynamic.
2. Demonstrate how these cases present to attorneys, and identify red flags and attorney do's and don'ts.
3. Assess the role of attorneys, judges/commissioners, and mental health professionals in cases when a child resists or rejects a parent.
4. Describe the need to implement a team approach to resolution/solution. Specific examples include customized confidentiality, model court orders, establishing goals, and knowing when to stop trying to enforce reunification.
5. Implement accountability practices with these cases, including the efficacy of contempt actions and other creative sanctions.
6. Identify the costs and financial consequences of a team approach vs. a standard litigation model.
